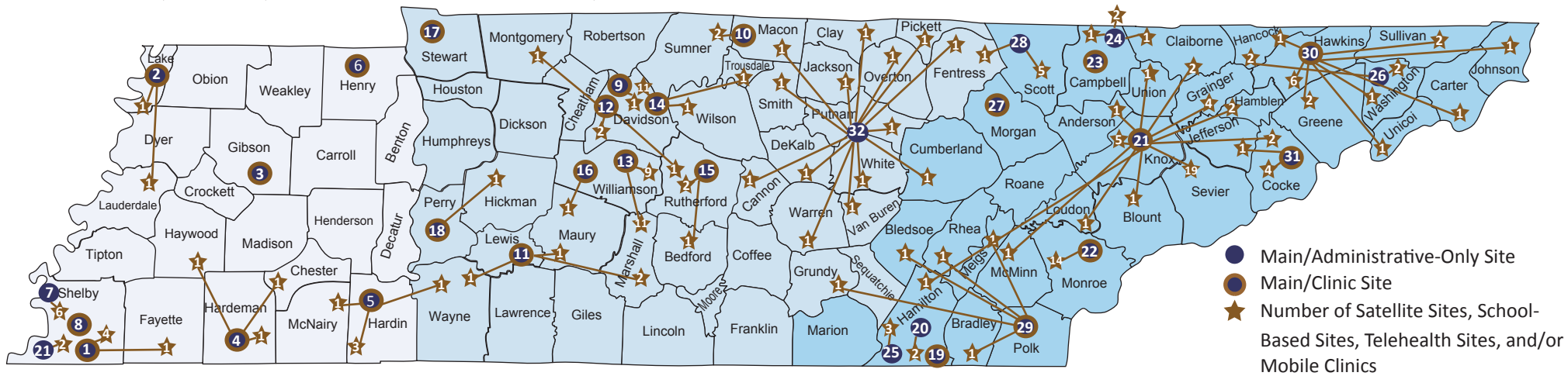


Tennessee Primary Care Association
